OIL FILTER PART 2

For the May newsletter I had written an article about Bob Jahnke's "forever dry" oil filter. Well after a very busy summer with Healey events here is part 2.

As mentioned before Bob had cleaned the components completely. Nothing seemed to be wrong with the filter housing. Since Bob had removed the oil pan to replace the gasket, we then checked both the pressure and return oil galleys in the block. No problems found there either. My last suggestion was to just re-assemble the filter and check it out after a few miles. Bob did, and now he has a filter like the rest of us, full of oil and???.

My guess at the problem was that the dirty filter bypass valve was stuck open allowing the oil to bypass the filter and go straight to the engine. Whatever the problem was it has now been corrected.

Some notes on oil filters and gaskets. I have had 'O' ring gaskets that failed after 500 miles. (economy filter) I have found two gaskets in the housing. Silicone or RTV are not a good idea to seal the can to the adaptor, but I do put a small amount of sealer around the washer head of the long bolt. (The rubber gasket is usually hard)




Dec. 5: Holiday Party
