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## 2015 Delegates Meeting

### Club reports:

Most clubs had the usual activities to report. Several had reported a fall-off in activities, as well as the Bonneville report. One Club which really stood out was the Manitoba Club; they produced and printed a hardbound copy of the Club’s history. Lots of photos of members and their cars.

Many Clubs are donating more to charities. Several Chapters have teamed up with worthwhile charities to stage their events.

### Committee reports:

Safety- Reminded that we need to watch the date on our tires. Don Cline told of one member on a tour having three tire failures with older tires, two of his and one borrowed from another member on the tour. He also reminded us that brake fluid has an expiration date.

### Regalia:

The online ordering of items appears to need a little more input as to what members would like. The items are offered quarterly in the Healey Marque. Delivery is approximately 60 days from when the ordering window closes.

### Membership:

Currently there are 3113 members and another 707 local only members. Dues notice will be going out purportedly before Thanksgiving.

### Finance:

Good news. No dues increase.

Delegates voted to begin digitizing club records, Phase one will be financials and by-laws.

It was recommended that clubs use a Facebook page. It seems to work better than a website.

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The following are notes taken by the AHCA National Membership Director, Mike Schneider at the Delegates Meeting:

## FROM THE DRIVER’S SIDE

The first weekend of November Ben and I traveled to Indianapolis for the fall delegates meeting. One

important point before the report starts: there will be no AHCA dues increase for 2016.

Fred opened the meeting Saturday morning with a moment of silence for those fellow Healeyphiles who have passed away this year. He then moved immediately to ask all of the military veterans to stand. Probably out of the 50 or so people in attendance about 20 of us stood up.

Traditionally after we get past a few housekeeping issues such as approving the minutes from the last meeting, etc, Fred calls for the delegates to give their reports. He asked that this time the delegates be a little more concise than in past years as we had a lot to do this weekend. Some of the comments from several of the clubs indicated they were having a very difficult time recruiting members to serve as local club officers. No magic solution was offered by any of the delegates for the officer shortage. There were some interesting comments. One of the more unique comments was from the northeast delegate who mentioned that at one of their meets they had a gymkhana that involved lawn tractors. Steve said it was very successful. The Carolina's club made about \$5,500.00 on Conclave 2014 and donated \$4,000 to the local Ronald McDonald House. The Smoky Mountain club donated \$4,000 to a ranch for abused and neglected children. Many of the clubs made donations to various charitable organizations in smaller amounts. The cash on hand for most of the clubs ranged from about \$6,000 to as much as \$40,000 (Oregon). A few clubs had a little less than the \$6,000 with the average hovering a little north of \$15,000. North Texas is succeeding in attracting some new younger members who all have Sprites.

Fred - Insurance- The Enclave meet presented a few challenges for providing insurance certificates. Sports and Touring had the same insurance carrier and similar types of coverage but the limits were much less than that of AHCA so Fred provided all of the necessary insurance certificates for the 2015 Enclave meet. The insurance coverage for the AHCA

will remain the same including the D & O coverage and Fred was able to negotiate a premium at the same amount as 2015. How often do you see that happening?

Reid-Healey Marque- 2015 production of the Healey Marque will come in a little under budget. Proposal for 2016 Healey Marque production increased by about \$100.00 per issue due to anticipated increases in paper costs. He has received a lot of positive comments regarding the increase in tech articles. Reid is still interested in a tech editor for the Marque. Contact Reid for specifics relating to the tech editor position.

Gary Feldman - Club Support-reviewed recent membership promotions. Not a howling success but enough to be worth continuing. Gary and Ben will coordinate on having some more promotional cards made. A second card that is the size of a calling card will also be produced and handed out. Dick Storrs had arranged for several local tours of various sites of interest. All the tours were very well attended.

Don Klein-Safety- some states are trying to remove ethanol from the gasoline sold in that state. There are several websites that will let you know where to find gas without ethanol. One mentioned is [pure.gas.org](http://pure.gas.org). Aimesoil is a counteractive agent to ethanol. Stabil also has a product called Protection that will counteract ethanol. Don also talked about SEMA. This is a national organization that has representatives in all of the states watching what each state congress is doing to or for our avocation/hobby. SEMA produces a newsletter almost on a monthly basis. The AHCA is a member of SEMA and as such you can sign up to receive the almost monthly newsletter and no charge. Contact Don for details.

Me- Membership- our membership is up almost 100 from last year. The new website has been very successful at attracting new members. About 80% of our new members for 2015 joined on the

website. Each year we have anywhere from 200 to 400 members that don't renew. Some have developed other interests, some sold their Healeys and some have passed away. We were very fortunate this year to see a small increase in membership. Many of the car clubs in the US are experiencing a downturn in membership. The delegates agreed to change the half years dues end date. The starting date for the half year dues is set for August 1. The previous close date for that dues had been October 31. It will now be Sept 30. That makes it much more reasonable for someone renewing or joining the club. As it had been in the past if a person joined or renewed in October they would pay \$35.00 dues. Then a month and a half later they would receive an invoice for another \$50.00 for the following year. The perception was that they just spent \$85.00 to be a member of the AHCA from October of one year to December of the following year.

Laurie Wilford - commercial advertising- Laurie has successfully collected the past due advertising revenue and is doing a very good job in attracting new advertisers.

Steve Bell - Regalia- Steve was somewhat disappointed with the response to the advertising campaign he worked out with one of the manufacturers in the New England area. He concluded that perhaps the required ordering approach had been a handicap. Each quarter a person had a one month window to place an order and the company then had two months to make the products ordered and ship them. Steve is going to make some changes to the process. He will work with the vendor and advertise products that can be ordered any time. The vendor will accumulate the orders and at the end of each month will manufacture the products ordered and then ship them. There will be seasonal items available as appropriate. Some promotional material will be emailed to the local newsletter editors for inclusion in the local newsletter. Since most all of the clubs

have gone to electronic newsletters Steve is hoping that all of the editors will include the promotional material since there will be no additional cost to have it listed.

Baird Foster - DMH fund-reported by Bev Sealand from a report provided by Baird. The fund currently has \$16,118.96. Two students in England will receive a grant for 500 lbs to help offset their tuition expense. Baird is investigating several vocational schools in the US in order to set up a similar process in the US. Several of the delegates had suggestions for two vocational schools that specialize in restoration of vehicles.

Bev Sealand - Treasurer- The AHCA is very sound financially. The actual expenses for 2015 as of this meeting were about \$14,000 below budget that was passed at the fall delegates meeting in November 2015.

Ben Moore - Promotion and Marketing - How many of us have children and grandchildren between the ages of 25 and 55? Most everyone in the room raised their hand. Ben is going to develop a program that promotes non-traditional outreach efforts. Use non Healey events to promote the club. Get active in your local community attending car shows that are marques other than Healey. Promote Sprites and Jensen Healeys to the people you know in the 25-55 age range. Those are the most affordable Healeys and make an excellent gateway into the world of Healeys. There will be a more aggressive effort in web advertising. Those side bars you see on Facebook and other social media forms that always have small advertising blocks will be the target for Ben in 2016. Due to the way the websites are constructed Ben will be able to know how many people click on the ad and also track how many join as a result of the ad. Ben would like to have an in-house graphic designer that would assist in developing graphics for the web site, promotional cards and magazine advertising. There is now a registry section on the AHCA website,

www.healeyclub.org. A member can go on the website and list their Healey information so that it can be tracked by the registrar for that model Healey. One benefit to that is it could help you find your Healey if it had been stolen. That is how Bob Russell in Texas found his Healey that had been stolen 40 years ago. Steve Byers, the BJ8 registrar noticed that a BJ8 was advertised for sale with a VIN number Steve had on file. When he checked the VIN number he found that the business advertising the BJ8 wasn't listed as the owner and Bob Russell was and the Healey had been filed with Steve as stolen. Eventually Bob got his Healey back, after not having it for 40 years. Another idea Ben is suggesting is that each local club develop their own Facebook page. It is easy and quick. While Ben was describing what to do John Jacobs created a Facebook page for his club, Ohio Valley, right there in the delegates meeting. It took him less than five minutes. Instagram is another social media site that can be used. Instagram has a huge number of photos of young people driving Healeys. Ben also reported back on the program that Haggerty is working on to advertise and promote various car clubs on their website. They are currently making some additional modifications to the site so the program is not up to full speed just yet.

Eddie Anderson - Historian - The delegate's handbook is on the AHCA website in the delegates section. Eddie is also working with Anne Johnson (AHCA secretary) and Eddie Lowery (AHCA asst. secretary) to digitize most all of the past paperwork for the AHCA. This is going to be quite a monumental job. There are thousands and thousands of pages to scan. Some of it involves financial reporting, tax reporting and membership information from decades ago. Iron Mountain is apparently the vendor of choice for this project.

Steve Bell - Enclave 2015-the event was very successful. All reports from the Sports and Touring Club indicate they were extremely satisfied with how the meet turned out. Approximately \$30,000

in profit was reported. Of that \$15,000 went to the Sports and Touring Club, \$7,500 went to the New England Region and \$7,500 went to the AHCA. That division of profits had been agreed to by all parties involved before any ink was put to paper. There was also a charity auction that raised an additional \$20,000 and all of that was donated to charity.

John Jacobs - Conclave 2016- John had an interesting slide presentation. They are putting emphasis on rare and unique Healeys, such as Silverstones, Westlands, Nashes, and Jensens etc. Steve Bell is loaning the committee an engine stand. I guess we will have to be there to see what they are going to do with that. A lot of early registrations have been coming.

Dave Nock - Conclave 2017 proposal - Dave had a nice presentation on a meet in Monterey, CA. As it turned out though the meet is already identified as the Rendezvous Meet for the Austin Healey Club USA. There would be no involvement required by the required by the AHCA thus it couldn't be a conclave or International meet. The end result of Dave's presentation is that he is inviting everyone to attend the meet in Monterey September 11 to 15, 2017. Room rates are \$159.00, which is an extremely good rate for Monterey.

Fred Dabney - Registry appointments- Roy Bowman will be the registrar for BN4, Russ Keep for the Modified Healeys (Nasty Boys) and John May for the Jensen Healeys.

Fred Dabney-proposed by law change. The end result of the change is that a local club president will be required to also be an AHCA member in order for the local club to be an AHCA affiliated club. Currently the membership director, treasurer and delegate are the only local officers required to be AHCA members. Changing the bylaws requires a two-step process. The proposal has to be read at one fall delegates meeting and then re-read at a

second fall delegates meeting and then voted on before the proposal can be added to the bylaws.

Don Klein - motion from the floor that a driving award be designated for presentation at the AHCA annual conclaves. The trophy will in honor of Ann Wisdom Riley and Pat Moss. The woman with the overall best performance in the gymkhana and rally will earn the trophy. Motion passed.

Breakout session 1- Fred and Ben proposed that the AHCA adjust the target age range for new members and fold this effort into the Future 50 program. The revised targeted age range is to be 25-55. Promote using Healeys in local advertising in your city or area. One consideration is that if we can get the Student/Associate membership numbers between 150 and 200 then purchase a Sprite to be raffled off to just the Student/Associate member group. A comment was noted that some states have laws that might impact the raffle effort. That will need to be investigated. Develop a stronger presence in social media. (Ben has that under control) Provide activities at for the younger people at conclave and perhaps regional meets. Enter your Healey in all of the parades in your town. Chuck Anderson said he used to do 15-20 parades per year. There is a vocational school in Kansas City and one in Pennsylvania that specialize in restoring a vehicle. AHCA should become active in promoting and working those two schools.

Breakout session 2 - The overall thrust of this session was focused on conclave. Develop a process that makes conclave easier for local clubs to host it. This will mean more involvement from the AHCA. The conclave in Colorado Springs in 2011 was an effort by the AHCA officers in conjunction with the Rocky Mountain club. The Rocky Mountain Club did things in which local knowledge of the area was necessary while the AHCA officers took care of the standard portion of the event. End result of all of the discussion was that the Conclave VP would provide a 'short list' of things that the local club

would need to be in charge of and a longer list that the AHCA will be responsible for in putting on the conclave. Some of the jobs could even be handled by other clubs. Don Klein and the Ohio Valley club could run the gymkhana for example, Bluegrass could do popularity, AHCA would take care of registration, promotion, treasury, etc. A proposal was made and approved to give the AHCA officers the authority to seek a conclave site for Conclave 2017 and pull together a group of clubs that could provide support. The AHCA officers would fill in the areas that regional clubs could not.

Bev Sealand - budget- The budget was accepted as presented. The proposed income would exceed the proposed expenses for 2016 by about \$2500.00. That plus a strong reserve keeps the AHCA on sound financial footing.

Gary Brierton-Nominating committee-All existing officers were nominated, no nominations from the floor and then all of the existing officers were approved by the delegates with a unanimous vote. Honorary proposals of Pete Sturtevant and John Heffron were voted on and accepted. No nominations for lifetime memberships were presented. Currently the nominating committee is made of all past presidents that wish to be on the committee plus two at large members from the delegate pool. A proposal was made and accepted to add a third delegate to the nominating committee. Bruce Gearns was nominated for this and was unanimously agreed to by the delegates. There was some discussion regarding how the membership knows when a position is available and how the process works for filling available positions. Gary is going to work to make this an even more open process. Bob Gilleland mentioned that it would be in the best interest of the AHCA if national officer candidates came from the ranks of those that have been active at the national level.

Fred Dabney - succession plan-Fred mentioned that each AHCA officer should have a person that can



step in and take over for at least a short term in the event the sitting officer is not able to continue. The president has the bylaw authority to appoint an interim person to take over a position until the next regularly schedule elections can be held. Fred is think that the president would then appoint the backup person to take over until the election. The backup person would be the ideal candidate for nomination to that position if they so desired.

Fred Dabney-reporting forms-Each year before the delegates meeting the delegates are required to fill out a number of reporting forms. Fred is proposing some changes to one of the forms. He is going to add a section for community support so that the club can mention what they did for the community. What new event did your club host this year is another category. Also a section to report on Future 50 efforts. Finally a new section to mention the local clubs MVP for the year and what they did to earn that designation.

Gary Brierton-websites and newsletters- Gary did a very extensive analysis of the local clubs websites and newsletters. Most clubs are way behind in keeping the website current. Very few had the most recent copy of the newsletter posted on the website. A suggestion was made by Steve Bell that the AHCA consider offering support to local clubs in developing a website or ways to improve their website. Providing access to the current webmaster for the AHCA at AHCA expense for limited consulting was also discussed.

Neil Anderson - Leroy and Sue Joppa-Neil was asked by the brother of Leroy to help him figure out what to do with all of the Healey stuff Leroy and Sue had amassed over the years. One thing Neil brought back with him were boxes and boxes of files going back to the seventies. Roger (Leroy's brother) let Neil take anything he saw that was Healey related as there is no one in the family that is interested. Neil did bring back quite a few items and they will be in various auctions in the coming years. Neil kept

nothing for himself. It took him two trips to bring everything back. A number of the items will be available in the auction at conclave. The proceeds of those items will go to the charities that Leroy and Sue supported and some will also go to the DMH fund. As Neil said, Healey People Helping Healey People.

Auction - Saturday evening at each fall delegates meeting a live (that means Gary Brierton was the auctioneer) auction is held. The hit of the night was a framed poster that belonged to Leroy and Sue that Neil brought back. The second biggest hit was the ABBA album and Bic Healey Autographed number 1 Healey Marque that I brought. Well at least that is my wishful thinking. I think all of the clothing that Hazel Klein embroidered and donated made up the real second biggest hit of the night. The auction produced almost \$1000 in receipts which will be used to offset part of the cost of the delegates meeting.

Don't forget to keep the rubber side down and the top side shiny.

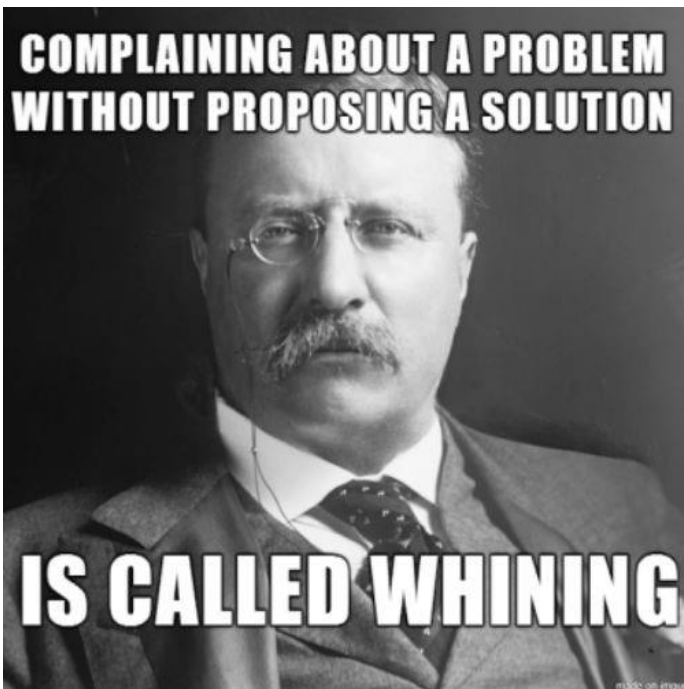
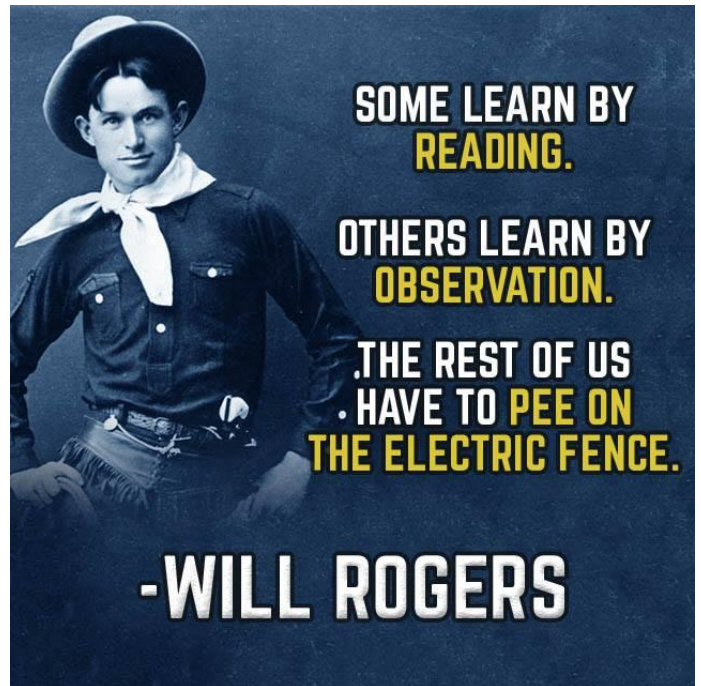
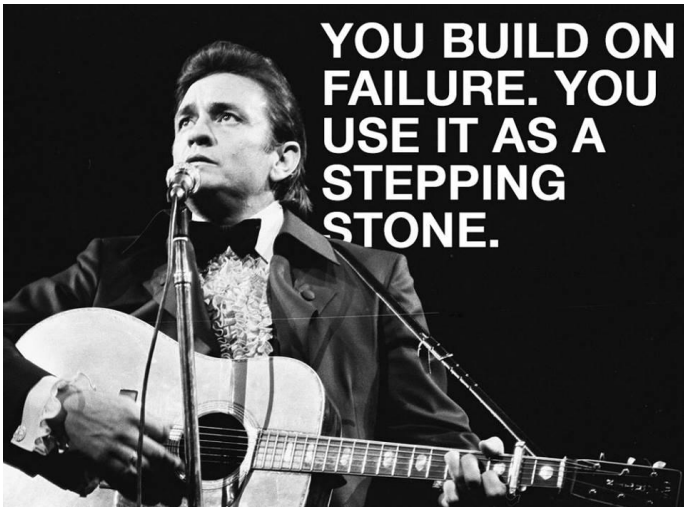
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### 2015 BAHC HOLIDAY DINNER

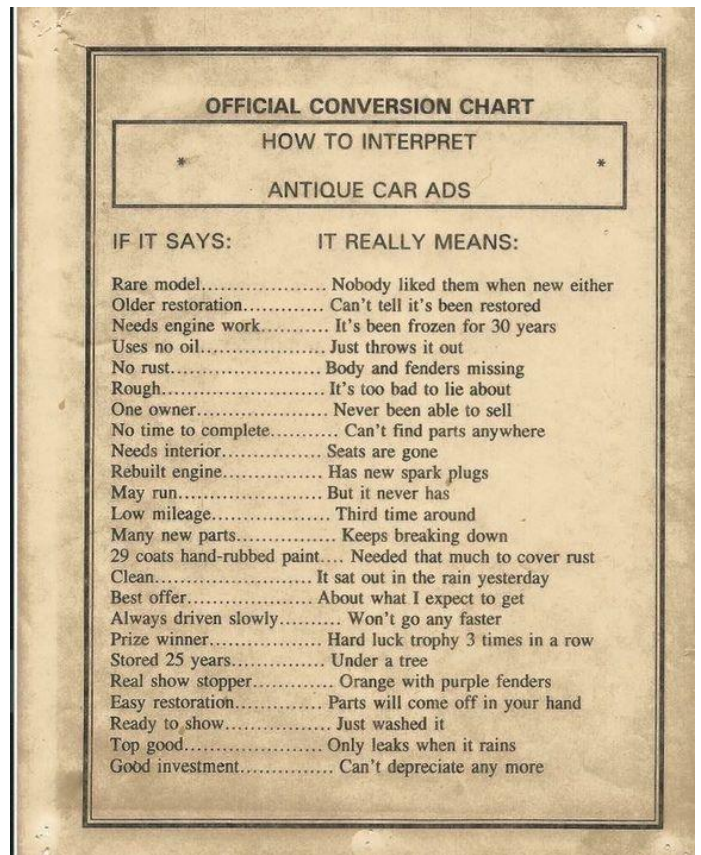
