Trip to Nelson, BC

(Our Version) Our trip to Nelson, BC started at 3 p.m. on Friday, July 21, at 13th South and 3rd West; the start of a Holiday weekend. The temperature was nearing 103°, and we stood in the shade of a semi's trailer waiting for all to arrive. Leaving on I-15 heading north the Maxwell's, Colman's, Jahnke's, and Lewis's encountered horrendous stop and go-a-foot traffic from Kaysville to North Ogden. The Healey's did remarkably well even at 230°.

The first night was spent at the Burley Inn in Burley, Idaho. The next day we were on to Sun Valley, had a refreshing drink, looked around Ketchum and then on towards the headwaters of the Salmon River. Convoying along at around 75 mph, a deer darted out and leaped over the bonnet of the Jahnke's car. After everyone caught their breath, we lunched at Stanley, Idaho. That night we were at Salmon, Idaho, in rooms with balconies facing the river. The next day we were on to Kalispell, Montana, where we spent the night. The next day's breakfast was in Libby, Montana, where we were introduced to Huckleberries at Henry's Café.

We then proceeded to Bonner's Ferry and on to the border crossing by Creston, BC, over the border and on to the drive along the east side of Kootenay Lake up to Kootenay Bay and onto the ferry that crosses to Balfour Harbor. A scenic drive took us on to Nelson, BC. The hotel was very nice, with a patio overlooking the boat docks on the lake.

The Healey Rendezvous in Nelson was somewhat of a disappointment; many of the events were cancelled presumably because there were too many cars. We were told there were about 200 cars. There was a car show at the Lakeside Park, which was nice but hot.

The eight of us took a walking tour of Historical Buildings in the City of Nelson, which was very interesting; we strolled through a street market; stopped at coffee houses for refreshment; found restaurants for dinners with live musical entertainment; had cocktails every night in the Lewis's "theme" room (Don insisted we must have had Nubian slaves that came to our room after the others went to their rooms).

The drive back to Utah was beautiful. We went through Sandpoint, Idaho, on to Coeur d'Alene, around the east side of the lake, on to Clarkston for the first night. Next day we went through McCall on Payette Lake, on through Boise to Twin Falls for the next night. The next morning (early) we left for Salt Lake arriving at our home in Sandy around 10 a.m.


