We have now reached the dry season. Just like that, the rains stop and everything starts to dry out. We have food back on the shelves and some gas. Because this country runs on a bus system, gas is still hard to come by. The roads are another problem. Last Friday the government was getting ready to open a section of Highway 1 when we had another mud slide and a section of the road slid away.

Tuesday we received 18 new missionaries. It took the buses 9 hours to drive from Guatemala City to Xela. The normal time is 4 hours. Most of the road is dirt and it is the only road between the two cities and is shared with big 18-wheelers. Another slide limited travel to 4WD trucks, which caused further complication in getting the missionaries to their destinations, but they are now in their new areas. We love each of you. Thanks for your love and support.


